We serve and teach, we receive and learn.

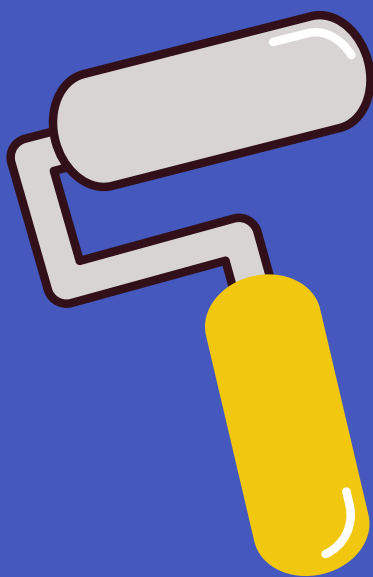

CONSTRUCTION AND RENEWAL



New construction work this summer involved the Hóčhoka Podcast production room (more information later), the Chapel hallway and a new parking lot for the Thrift Store. New equipment included an air handler/HVAC in the museum, a generator and mini templifier for back-up heat, a fuel tank for the generator in the boiler building, and AC installation in the templifier building.

REFRESHING EXISTING STRUCTURES



Facilities kept the place sharp-looking and functional by painting four homes and the top floor of the school; re-carpeting three homes and the top floor of the school; placing new heating units in Dennis and Ambrose Homes and new ductwork in the Benedictine Building; and installing and upgrading the Internet, camera, cable T.V. and signal boosters.

MAINTAINING GROUNDS



Extra summer work to maintain and beautify our grounds involved an impressive one-day, earth-moving event that excavated an underground fuel tank between the museum and Freimann Business Office, and landscaping the south side of Tipi Press and the Benedictine Courtyard.
