ČHAŇKÚ LÚTA SCHOLARSHIP

The St. Joseph's Indian School ČhaŇkú Lúta Scholarship, initiated by the Congregation of the Priests of the Sacred Heart (CPOSH) Board, aims to support Native American students by providing money to support further education. Eligible recipients may receive multiple scholarship assistance awards.* The St. Joseph's Indian School ČhaŇkú Lúta Scholarship is considered a need-based scholarship.

ČhaŇkú Lúta is Lakota for the "Red Road," a commitment to live life in the best way possible with respect for oneself, others, all of creation and the Creator. For Christians, it is the road that Christ walked in giving his life for others. The St. Joseph's Indian School ČhaŇkú Lúta Scholarship exists to support students pursuing higher education who exemplify the ČhaŇkú Lúta way of life.

**Award recipients may reapply and receive up to ten scholarship awards. St. Joseph's Indian School alumni who have been awarded ten scholarships may be eligible for further scholarships (subject to funding availability).*

SCHOLARSHIP ALLOCATION:

In alignment with our commitment to support, we prioritize the allocation of scholarships as follows:

1. St. Joseph's Indian School alumni:
 - a. Preference will be given to applicants who are alumni of St. Joseph's Indian School. Alumni are defined as any student who attended St. Joseph's Indian School and lived on campus. We value the ongoing connection and contributions of our alumni community and seek to support alumni in pursuing educational opportunities.

2. Thiwáhe (immediate) family members of St. Joseph's Indian School alumni:
 - a. Thiwáhe (immediate) family members of St. Joseph's Indian School alumni will be considered for scholarship funding after funds have been allocated to alumni applicants. We acknowledge the significance of familial ties and aim to extend support to family members of St. Joseph's Indian School alumni.
3. Native American applicants:
 - a. Native American applicants not listed in the two preceding categories will be considered for the scholarship following the allocation of funding to St. Joseph's Indian School alumni and thiwáhe (immediate) family members of St. Joseph's Indian School alumni.

COMMITTEE AND APPLICANT EXPECTATIONS:

The St. Joseph's Indian School Čhaŋkú Lúta Scholarship Committee will provide timely and sincere support for an applicant's educational pursuits, including responsive handling of scholarship materials and a commitment of prayer. The St. Joseph's Indian School Čhaŋkú Lúta Scholarship Committee hopes scholarship recipients will hold a commitment to live the Čhaŋkú Lúta way of life with respect for themselves, others, all of creation, and the Creator.

APPLICATION AND ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

1. Complete the St. Joseph's Indian School scholarship online application.
2. Applicants will be required to provide the following documents as part of the scholarship application:
 - a. Copy of the applicant's tribal identification card or Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood (CDIB).
 - b. College acceptance letter (first-time college students only).
 - c. Previous semester grades (for current and continuing college students).
 - i. An unofficial or official transcript will be accepted.
 - ii. A 2.0 GPA is preferred.
 - d. Class schedule for the upcoming semester.
 - i. Full-time or part-time students may apply.
 - e. Financial aid needs analysis form completed by financial aid officers at the applicant's attending college or university, or a financial aid award letter detailing the applicant's award and cost of attendance information.

All applicants are required to complete the application and submit the required documentation including proof of tribal enrollment. Financial needs will be assessed through the submission of relevant financial documents. The scholarship committee reserves the right to make final decisions regarding award recipients, taking into consideration the availability of funds, the number of qualified applicants, timeliness in receiving completed applications, use of grammar within the application, etc.

The scholarship application is considered yearly. Applicants will be required to complete the application in its entirety each academic year. Applicants approved for the full, current academic year (fall and spring semester) will be required to submit the "Spring Returning Application" by the deadline listed below to receive continued funding for the spring semester. Applicant award funding amounts provided in the fall may differ for the spring semester depending on available funding. Applicants can apply for one semester within the academic period, but the priority in funding will be allocated to applicants approved for the full, current academic year.

St. Joseph's Indian School alumni may contact the Alumni Relations Department to discuss education-related expenses and summer semester educational assistance options prior to the semester deadlines. Assistance may or may not be available.

APPLICATION DEADLINES:

FALL AND SPRING

- Fall and spring application period: May 1—August 1
- Fall application period (if only applying for the fall): May 1—August 1
- Spring application period (if only applying for the spring): November 1—December 15

SPRING RETURNING APPLICATION (applicants approved for the current academic year)

- Spring returning application period: November 1—December 15
 - Applicants must submit fall grades and an upcoming spring semester schedule by the deadline in order to receive a spring award. It is the responsibility of the applicant to update the scholarship contact regarding delayed schedules or fall grades prior to the deadline.
